## AMSER Activities

### Membership Committee

As of December, 2012, AMSER had 264 total members, making it the largest of the Alliances. That includes 137 active members, 8 members of the Alliance of Medical Student Coordinators in Radiology and 119 junior AMSER members.

### Education Committee

The AMSER curriculum has been updated and year-specific learning objectives have been added to it.

AMSER has been approached by the Society of Radiologists in Ultrasound regarding development of a joint ultrasound curriculum appropriate for medical students. A timeline for medical student instruction will be available by April.

The first AMSER-ACER Academic Radiology Edition will be published in March, 2013. It attracted 40 submissions, 14 of which were chosen. Our thanks to Dr. Aine Kelly who has worked tirelessly on this. We hope that this will be an annual or biannual publication.

## **Long-Range Planning Committee**

AMSER is considering proposals to streamline the current committee structure to recognize changes that have occurred over the years and to help distribute the tasks evenly. The long-range planning committee itself may become a permanent committee.

## **Joint ACR/AMSER Project**

At the request of the American College of Radiology, AMSER, under the supervision of Dr. Chris Straus, formed a committee to develop a survey on Student Education in Radiology. The survey was sent out to medical school Dean's offices, clerkship directors and PGY1 interns. The goal is to develop and publish a white paper on the status of radiology medical education.

## **Electronic Communication Committee**

### **1) AMSER website**

The new, extended AMSER website template has been submitted to the AUR along with a considerable number of new resource materials. AMSER is looking forward to the deployment of this new site by the AUR with an extensive and comprehensive array of new resources.

### **2) AMSER Standardized Exam**

Over 400 students have taken the final version of the exam (over a hundred completed the draft). The exam mean was 74%, sd 9.3. About a hundred more questions have been submitted that Dr. Petra Lewis has entered into Radiology ExamWeb (REW) with the help of Jim Chen. Exam template topics in need of additional material have been allocated to various writers in time to work on a second version before the AUR meeting.

### **3) Other Radiology ExamWeb updates**

Drs. Lewis and McNulty secured funding to support updates and student usage of Radiology ExamWeb this year from the ACR, RSNA and Hudson Foundation.

There has been considerable interest from international medical schools, which Dr. Lewis is exploring.

About 3,500 students have taken exams, 1,700 questions are currently available and 30 institutions are using the system

Several upgrades have been made to Radiology ExamWeb, including the ability to add pop-up images and making exam statistics available to instructors, as well as comparisons with national statistics for shared exams. The manual has been updated and circulated.

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## **Electronic Communication Committee**

*Academic Radiology* has accepted an article describing the development of Radiology ExamWeb, with members of the AMSER Electronics Committee coauthoring the article describing the development of the AMSER Standardized exam.

### **4) AMSER Shared Resources**

Dr. Nancy McNulty has worked with several committee members on updating, adding to and categorizing the AMSER Shared Resources database. We also added more AMSER ID images.

More than 6,000 images are now available, deidentified, AMSER- watermarked and organized into folders to facilitate downloading.

Of the new resources being added, many will be lectures used in pre-clinical student education in radiology These Shared Resources will all be available on the new AMSER website.

### **5) AMSER Residency Guide**

Dr. Sravanthi Reddy has updated the guide for 2013 and it will be posted on the new AMSER website

### **6) AMSER Professionalism Module**

The professionalism module has been posted on the current website and a “resident version” of the module has been posted by APDR. We are looking at hosting this on MedU so that there is a means of recording student usage for evaluation reporting purposes.

### **7) CORE (Case-based On-line Radiology Education)**

AMSER members formed the editorial board for CORE. Sixteen cases are available (MSK trauma added this year) and 30 institutions are currently using these. A 17th (cardiac imaging ) will be added this year. About 30 AMSER members served as peer reviewers for the cases, while another 16 have agreed to be case editors.
