Dr. Meltzer's academic output includes a staggering 74 NIH grants on which she has served as principal investigator, coinvestigator. or consultant. Dr. Melzer has contributed 174 original reports to our body of knowledge. Dr. Meltzer has served as a scientific federal grant reviewer since 1997, including her extensive specific service for the National Institutes of Health and its numerous study sections. Dr. Meltzer as a uniquely experienced and qualified physician-investigator has served the Academy for Radiology and Biomedical Imaging Research since 2008, having led and established a number of the Academy's committees and initiatives, culminating in her service as President from 2015 through 2017.
