Dr. Slanetz is a clinician, teacher, researcher, mentor, role-model, and sponsor extraordinaire. Truly, she embodies the ACER mission of promoting and advancing the careers of clinicianeducators.

Dr. Slanetz earned her medical doctorate and master's in public health degrees and subsequently completed her radiology residency and breast imaging fellowship at the Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard Medical School where she was awarded the AAWR Distinguished Resident in Diagnostic Radiology. Over the next 22 years, she developed and built her career at institutions such as Brigham and Women's Hospital, Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, Tufts University School of Medicine, and Boston University School of Medicine, where she is currently Professor of Radiology.

While she works clinically as a breast imager, Dr. Slanetz is a passionate educator.
